The regular meeting of the Climate Action Plan Standing Committee was held on Wednesday, the 17<sup>th</sup> of December 2025 at 3:30 p.m. in the City Council Chambers Conference Room at City Hall, 418 East 2<sup>nd</sup> Street.

**A. Call to Order- 3:37**

**B. Approval of Minutes from the August 20<sup>th</sup>, 2025 meeting- not available. Approval of Minutes from the October 15<sup>th</sup>, 2025 meeting- motion made by Robin, seconded by Ben, passed unanimously.**

**C. Public Comment- none.**

**D. CAP Term Limits- Keegan plans to reapply. Nathan and Stasia will not be reapplying for their positions.**

**E. Recap of Future-Ready Homes Fair- Robin shared the successful event at City Hall last month, and the committee plans to host again next year.**

**F. Communications/Outreach/Education- Tammy discussed the response that the committee received from the architect on the high school expansion project. Tammy discussed some of the highlights from the letter where the project will be trying to implement some of the goals of the CAP, These include: replacing the large inefficient pumps with smaller high efficiency circulators, decoupling the boiler plant from the hot water system so the boilers can be shut down in the summer, the new athletics field building is going to be designed to be fully electric, upgrading the heating system with an energy recovery ventilator to replace 2 natural gas services, as well as a lot of information on future solar possibilities. The committee continued to discuss ways that it can get involved with developments earlier in the design process so it can help identify climate goals and make suggestions. Keegan suggested getting some contractors in to speak to committee about code and/or how we could better converse with each other. Tammy will reply to letter.**
